THE CRIBS CONNECTION PROJECT

As part of their IB CAS project, BA students Samantha R., Madi B., Chiyo V., Niko T., and Nina N. are rallying the BA community to donate to the CRIBS Foundation. The funds will support various sectors where the orphanage has requested financial assistance, with the specific areas to be determined based on the total amount raised.

The group chose CRIBS because one of their members had previously worked with the organization and witnessed firsthand the impact of their work. The mission of CRIBS, which provides care for abandoned children and offers recovery programs for those who have experienced abuse, resonated deeply with them. Initially aiming for ₱20,000–₱30,000, the students are thrilled to have surpassed this goal and are now striving for ₱40,000–₱50,000. Donations will be accepted until February 7, 2024.
