#### LETTER TO THE COMMUNITY

Dear BA Community,

We find ourselves at a pivotal point in the school calendar. The mock exams for our seniors just ended, and in just 14 days, the BA Pathway exams will commence, followed by the IB Exams in 21 days. The deadline for the core requirements of Grade 12 students is fast approaching—set for April 15—adding another layer of urgency for our seniors. For Grade 10 students, the final papers for the Personal Project are currently undergoing moderation, marking a key milestone in their MYP journey. Meanwhile, students in Grades 7 to 9 are preparing for their first-ever End-of-Year exams, an important academic transition and a new experience that will shape their learning journey going forward. Seven weeks from now, the MYP End-of-Year exams will officially begin. These are challenging times for our academic community—times that call on every member of the BA Leadership Team to consider how best to rally our students and staff to stay strong and persevere.

This moment in time is being framed by two sacred events in two of the world's major religions. On April 1, the Muslim community celebrated the end of Ramadan, a month of fasting. Ramadan also commemorated the revelation of the Qur'an to Muhammed. On April 13, Palm Sunday, Roman Catholics will begin Holy Week with Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, marking the beginning of His Passion. These spiritual milestones are not only significant in religious life—they also coincide with actual school holidays, when classes are suspended and work is paused. These built-in breaks offer our entire community a much-needed opportunity to pause, reflect, and recover amidst the rush of academic demands. Within our own school, 32 students and one teacher recently completed weeks of spiritual preparation that culminated in their Confirmation on March 29—a deeply meaningful step in their faith journey. Taken together, these moments of sacred observance and school-wide rest remind us that even in the busiest seasons, space for stillness, renewal, and spiritual grounding is essential.

In light of this, perhaps the call to simply "power through" needs tempering. Perhaps we are invited to reflect on balance. The drive to persist—to not give up in the face of exams, papers, and deadlines—is expected from teachers, parents, and peers alike. And rightly so. At this stage, the finish line is near. To quit now would be to forgo all the progress made so far.

Both faiths value perseverance and endurance. As Christians are reminded in Romans 5:3-4: "We also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope." And likewise, Muslims hold fast to the assurance in Surah Al-Inshirah 94:6: "Indeed, with hardship [will be] ease."

Still, wisdom also lies in knowing when to pause. When does pushing forward cross the line into burnout? When does perseverance begin to deplete rather than strengthen? When the body begins to tire, the mind starts to blur, and motivation gives way to mere survival. Perhaps those are signs that the call to endure must be matched with a call to rest. This isn't weakness; it's discernment. It's the kind of wisdom that understands human limitations—not as failures—but as built-in reminders that we need community, grace, and replenishment. A "pause" doesn't mean abandoning one's goals. Rather, it's a strategy for sustaining the journey. The voices calling students to keep going must also be the ones that give them permission to slow down when their well-being is at risk. Teachers, parents, and peers share in this responsibility—not only to cheer from the sidelines, but also to offer refuge when the race feels too long.

Sacred texts speak to this balance. The Quran reminds us in Surah At-Talaq 65:2-3: "And whoever fears Allah – He will make for him a way out and will provide for him from where he does not expect." Similarly, Ecclesiastes 3:1 tells Christians: "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens."

When students of faith feel torn between enduring and resting, they can find reassurance in these words: "Cast your cares on the Lord and He will sustain you; He will never let the righteous be shaken" (Psalm 55:22 NIV), and "Allah does not burden a soul beyond that it can bear" (Surah Al-Baqarah 2:286). These verses remind us that divine compassion considers our frailty. Striving is noble, but so is knowing when to give in to care—both self-care as well as the care we extend to and accept from others.

As we move toward the final stretch of this academic year, we urge our students to aim high, finish strong, and bring their best selves to the work ahead. But we also emphasize this: academic excellence should never come at the cost of one's physical or mental well-being. The journey of learning is not a sprint—it is a marathon that requires endurance, pacing, and rest. As always, our teachers, advisers, and counselors will not push students forward without first walking alongside them. We are here not only to guide and to teach, but to steady and to support. We believe in hard work, yes—but we also believe in holding space for breath, for recovery, and for grace. Let this be a season of strength, but also of compassion—for our students, for each other, and for ourselves.


The Beacon Academy will be hosting an Open House on Saturday, April 12, from 9:30 AM to 11:30 AM at the Beacon Academy campus.

#### ATHLETIC UPDATES

It's been an exciting end to the month for sports in the Griffin community! Here are some updates on what's happened over the last few weeks and what's coming up ahead.

Last Saturday, March 29, Happy A. participated in the BSM Leg 2 Swimming Tournament, competing in the 50-meter freestyle, backstroke, and breaststroke, here she demonstrated great enthusiasm and true Griffin spirit.

The following day, March 30, the Griffin chess team competed in the "MISAA Chess Leg 2: Individual Tournament," with student-athletes participating in both the 14u and 19u categories. The Griffins performed exceptionally well, with all players in both divisions placing in the top 15. Notable performances included Zach C. (Grade 7), who earned a gold medal, Zac J. (Grade 8), who finished 5th in the 14u category, and Sandro Mendoza (Grade 10), who placed 4th in the 19u division.

On April 3, the Griffin football team played their final preliminary game of the MISAA 5v5 Football Tournament against Domuschola International School. The Griffins emerged victorious with a 5-2 win, securing second place in the rankings.

Lastly, other sports teams will be competing this Saturday, April 5, at Beacon School and Chinese International School Manila! Our Griffin basketball team will play their final game of the preliminary round against CISM. Later in the day, our Griffin volleyball teams will compete in the knockout rounds of their respective tournaments. The girls will face Domuschola International School (DIS)/Chinese International School Manila (CISM), the boys will go up against Fountain International School (FIS), and the mixed team will play against the third-ranked team.

With our teams vying for the top seed, the Griffins are soaring into the final stretch of the season with pride and determination—let's keep the momentum going! Go Griffins!









#### BA WOODPUSHERS CONQUER 2ND LEG OF MISAA CHESS

On March 30, 2025, 13 Beacon Academy chess players came prepared and ready to compete, playing their way to the top of the rankings. Jimmy M. (Grade 12), Patrick Dg. (Grade 11), Ysabel Dg. (Grade 11), Enzo C. (Grade 11), Phoenix G. (Grade 11), Nico F. (Grade 11), Sandro M. (Grade 10), and Criston Y. (Grade 10) all competed in Division 1. After five grueling rounds of chess, Beacon Academy finished with the most cumulative points, securing their place at the top.

In Division 2, the 14-and-under section, Zach C. (Grade 7) dominated with a perfect score of 5 out of 5. Zac J. (Grade 8) placed 5th with 4 points, while Joshua G. (Grade 7) and Nigel A. (Grade 7) finished in the 8th-14th range.

Leading up to the event, the chess team was trained and coached by Beacon Academy faculty members Roy Villegas and Josh Bersamina. Over 120 students from more than 10 schools participated in the event.


