LETTER TO THE COMMUNITY

Dear Beacon Academy Community,

Good day! We just came back from a four-day weekend mandated by the government to promote local tourism. Hopefully, beyond that, the unexpected long break gave us a chance to reflect on the significance of these holidays

The long weekend was due to two holidays: one commemorating an event from 128 years ago and the other from 41 years ago. Both events were catalysts for two separate revolutions in our nation's history. The first was to break free from a colonial power that lasted for 333 years, while the second was a revolution to end a 20-year dictatorship.

One hundred twenty years ago, Andres Bonifacio had to think and act quickly because the Spaniards had discovered the Katipunan. The Revolution, which aimed to free his people, was in danger of being nipped in the bud. It was the resolve of his compatriots at the time that pushed the Revolution forward with the cry, "Long Live the Philippines!" These men and women are the heroes we honor on National Heroes Day.

Forty-one years ago, Ninoy Aquino stepped off the plane that brought him back from exile. The people who opposed the Marcos dictatorship awaited direction and inspiration from Ninoy, only to be tragically disappointed by news of his murder on the tarmac of what is now the Ninoy Aquino International Airport. These same people, along with millions of other Filipinos, would rise and exile Ferdinand Marcos Sr. Ninoy is the person we honor every year on August 21.

While the law requires us to remember, the holidays encourage and allow us to rest and reflect. However, it is up to us to make these days meaningful. Beacon Academy, in its vision, calls us to be "of consequence to the country." It is our hope that understanding the significance of these two holidays will help us determine how we can contribute to our nation.

Last weekend was a good one for me. It gave me time to attend a party, organize my sock drawer, and explore Manila with my family. Writing this letter reminded me of National Heroes Day and Ninoy Aquino Day because a newsletter should focus on important matters for young minds to consider. Next year, I promise myself to reflect on Andres Bonifacio and Ninoy Aquino to ask how I have mattered to the country and what more I can do. I invite my fellow Griffins to do the same. Long live the Philippines!


