ALTERNATIVE CLASS DAYS REMINDERS

Alternative Class days are workshop sessions that engage students in focused experiential learning. The days are spent in an exploration of ideas that are not usually taught in the regular classroom setting. Workshops are led by current teachers, but some are facilitated by practitioners outside of school.

We have them to remind ourselves that not all learning happens in the classroom, or within the traditional construct of subjects, class discussions, or textbooks. Some of the best learning comes out of exploring someone else's passion and making it ours. Alternative class days are still school days, so all the BA handbook rules apply. The school will cover basic workshop costs. For some workshop activities, additional costs will be covered by the students for professional fees, transportation costs and other incidentals.

The Alternative Class days this year will run from January 30-31, Tuesday and Wednesday next week, and is comprised of on-site and off-site workshops that are meant to extend learning in the classroom, develop new skills, and allow students to make meaningful connections. All off-campus workshops are supervised by faculty, staff and a security officer.

This year's final ACD offerings are the following: Doodles and Stamps, Happy Potters, Paper Engineering, Quiapo-Chinatown Cultural Heritage Tour, Intramuros-Luneta Tour, Buhay Binanse, Sports and Adventure, and College Survival Cooking. There was much excitement during the registration to these workshops.

Note that all students on the Quiapo-Chinatown Cultural Heritage Tour and Intramuros-Luneta Tour will depart from PCPD at 7.15 am, and should be back by 4pm. Those on the Buhay Binanse Tour will depart from BA at 8.30 and should be back on campus before 4pm.

All students who are going off-campus, and/or have signed up for workshops with participation fees, need to submit the requisite permission slips to Ms. Francia Olayon either physically or via email at ibassoc@beaconacademy.ph, and forward payment to the Finance Office, or via bank transfer. If this has not been done yet, it is requested that this be completed by **3pm on Monday**, **29 January**.


