### AUTISM AWARENESS CAMPAIGN OF NATHAN C.

As part of my autism awareness campaign for my Senior Project, I've displayed some books outside the library that can help gain a better understanding and perspective of the spectrum. Below are short summaries of the books currently displayed. Please feel free to borrow any of these books if you want to know more about the autism spectrum disorder.

Inside Daniel's Head: "Inside Daniel's Head" is a chapter book written by Filipino author Joji Reyes-Santos. It's told from the point of view of Daniel, a boy who is under the autism spectrum disorder. The book offers readers an insight into how one who is under the spectrum is wired and how he thinks. It demonstrates the effect on his family and his perspective on the world. Daniel has an incredibly moving backstory that leaves readers with a lasting impression.

**Doobiedoo Asks:** "Doobiedoo Asks" is a comic book written by Filipino author Bambi Eloriaga-Amago and illustrated by her husband Roland Amago. The story is actually told from the perspective and based on the real experiences of the author, the mother of a son named Doobie, a child who likes to joke around and ask lots of questions. But one day, Doobie asks a more unusual question: "What's wrong with me?" Determined to help Doobie out, the parents soon find out that he is under the autism spectrum disorder. The book dives into the different unexpected challenges the author and her husband had to face and overcome, as well as things they learned on the way, in order for Doobie to gain the confidence to succeed in school. This comic has won awards both locally and nationally, which includes first place for the Philippine International Books Festival.



**Too Loud! Soothing Sensory Overload with Music:** "Too Loud! Soothing Sensory Overload with Music" is a children's picture book written by Filipino author Bambi Eloriaga-Amago and illustrated by Gani Riel Cabezas, both of who are autism awareness advocates. The story is about a girl named Jean and her best friend Elmo, who is under the autism spectrum disorder. Elmo has a great ear for music, but finds loud noises irritating and causes him to get anxious. One day, on a rowdy bus ride home, Elmo starts to panic. Jean and the rest of her friends work together to find a way to help Elmo calm down.

**The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-time:** "The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-time" is a prize winning bestseller written by English author Mark Haddon. The novel tells the story a 15 year old boy with autism named Christopher Boone, who one day discovers his neighbor's dog dead in her yard, speared with a pitch fork. In curiosity to find out the truth, Christopher decides to solve the mystery of this incident. - Nathan C.
