Dear Beacon Academy Community,

This week, we celebrated two holidays- the Day of Valor, otherwise known as the Araw ng Kagitingan, and the Muslim holiday Eid'l Fitr also known as the Feast of Ramadan. Two back-to-back holidays which, along with the the Mayor's directive to pivot online, allowed everyone a welcome extended weekend of sorts

Reflection comes easier when there is time to breathe and decompress, and surely, our country's observance of the two holidays this week does give fodder for reflection.

On April 9, the President of the Philippines made his way to Mount Samat in Bataan, where he laid a wreath on the memorial for the fallen Filipino soldiers who fought courageously until the Fall of Bataan during World War II. 





















PARENT COFFEE AT BEACON SCHOOL WITH DR. ALIANAN | RECAP

BA'S IGNITE PARTNERS WITH THE EMILIO AGUINALDO MUSEUM I RECAP

Beacon Academy's IGNITE Team is a student-led community outreach organization aimed to establish partnership between the Beacon Academy and socio-civic organizations. On March 24, 2024, the IGNITE team went to Emilio Aguinaldo Museum (EAM) in Kawit, Cavite to train and serve as Museum Tour Guides also knows as Docents. This initiative aims to educate guests about critical periods in Philippine history and see this as a potential partnership between the Beacon Academy and EAM for further authentic learning experiences.





Here are the students' reflections on the experience:

The experience was honestly nerve wracking at first as being a tour guide put us in a position of responsibility where the information we would share would be taken as truth by the visitors. Our oral delivery and language posed as our main challenge as we were mostly inexperienced in the activity and Filipino is not the first language for most of our group. However, with the help of our partners, we believe that we were able to execute an informative guide for the tourists we interacted with. If we were to invite other students from the BA community, I think this would greatly help them in appreciating and understanding parts of our culture that are excluded from history class.
