The Beacon Academy's Counseling Resource Center represented the school in the recently concluded events, the Global University Counsellor Connect (GUCC) last May 2-4 and the IB University Admission Meeting last May 2. These events were held in Singapore and two of our counselors (College Counselor- Maricar Pascual and CRC Director- Vian Erasmo) were able to connect, collaborate, and exchange ideas with university counselors and Admissions representatives from various countries.

The GUCC event was a great opportunity to share and learn best practices to address common challenges. The conference provided a platform for the participants to empower one another and strengthen community-building. At the same time, our counselors were able to join the university/college tours around Singapore to learn more about various campuses and their Admissions processes. These colleges/universities were: Nanyang Technological University (NTU), Yale-NUS College, SIM Global Education, and Singapore Management University (SMU).

On the other hand, the IB University Admission Meeting was a collaborative effort of the IB, the college counselors, and university admissions officers in ensuring a smooth transition for Diploma Program students in Asia-Pacific region to higher education options.
