








SAFETY PROTOCOL TALK | RECAP

Congratulations to the Academy's very own teacher librarian Ms. Zarah Gagatiga, on her recent appointement as PRO of the Philippine Association of Schools Librarians, Inc. (PASLI). Ms.Gagatiga's term will run from 2023-2025.

Ms. Gagatiga has 13 years of work experience as a librarian trained in the IB Programs, namely the MYP and the DP. She receives continuous training on the conduct of the Extended Essay (EE) being assigned as EE supervisor in every academic year and having been an EE Coordinator in 2015 and 2017. Apart from her regular administrative and academic duties as teacher librarian, she is a part of the core team in-charge of the regular assessment of the Academy as a PCNC certified NGO.

She is an author of children's books, storyteller, bibliotherapist, reading clinician and literacy coach. Her exposure and experience as school librarian, storyteller and bibliotherapist inspire her to learn and understand inclusion, diversification of library services and programs and the promotion of safe space. Recognized by peers in the school library profession for her contributions to the growth of children's literature in the country, Zarah designs and develops modules and


