




YOU'RE INVITED: FROM PAGE TO STAGE


BOOK REVIEW BY MS. Z (12:01)

In line with Buwan ng Wika and our continued reflection on Martial Law literature, Head Librarian Ms. Zarah Gagatiga shares her insightful review of 12:01, a powerful graphic novel written by Russell Molina and illustrated by Kajo Baldisimo.

Launched in 2016 by Anino Comics and the EDSA People Power Commission, 12:01 is set during the final years of Martial Law and the 1986 People Power Revolution. The story follows four young bandmates who, after missing curfew, are drawn into a night of loss, bravery, and a deepened resolve to pursue music in the name of freedom and a fallen friend.


