LETTER TO THE COMMUNITY

Dear Beacon Academy Community,

I believe, as Master Oogway in Kung Fu Panda once said, that "there are no accidents." Events do not simply happen at random; they unfold with meaning, often aligning in ways we may not immediately recognize. It is up to us, as Master Shifu's teacher would remind us, to find significance in these moments and to decipher the meaning behind seemingly intentional occurrences.

Perhaps not on the same scale as the great planetary alignment of March 10, 1982, when all nine planets stood on one side of the sun, but still with a sense of meaningful timing, three important national events have taken place in just the last couple of weeks.

The first is the commemoration of President Sergio Osmeña's Proclamation No. 35, which established the nationwide celebration of the Filipino language. Since the founding of the Beacon Academy, we have honored this occasion. This year, for the first time, we celebrated it in its rightful month. Staying true to our identity as a Filipino school, we upheld our founders' vision that Filipino should be taught and learned as a language for both education and social interaction.

The second significant event is the commemoration of Ninoy Aquino's life and sacrifice on August 21. At the Beacon Academy, this observance begins a series of activities that invite discourse on democracy, freedom, and human rights in modern Philippine history. To mark this, we have been showing films in our common spaces that highlight these themes. We have also tied yellow ribbons to symbolize our appreciation for Ninoy's return in 1983, a gesture that continues to remind us of his courage and sacrifice.

Finally, this week we celebrate National Heroes Day, a moment to honor not only our named heroes but also the countless unnamed individuals who gave voice and strength to the call for resistance and revolution. It is a time to remember that history is not only shaped by the great figures whose names we recite but also by the ordinary men and women who stood with them. Farmers, workers, students, mothers, and fathers contributed in their own ways to carry the struggle forward. Their sacrifices, though often unseen, gave power to the movements that secured our freedom and dignity as a people.

How, then, might Master Oogway interpret this alignment? I would venture to say he would remind us that our identities are deeply tied to the language we speak, and our language, in turn, shapes our understanding of who we are. When our grasp of language strengthens our sense of self, we become less vulnerable to abuse. And when silence is no longer enough, our voices, through words, shouts, and cries, carry the weight of truth.

History shows us that when we fight for what is right and for our collective identity, we do so alongside both the celebrated and the anonymous. Heroes such as Andres Bonifacio, Jose Rizal, and Benigno Aquino Jr. gave their names and lives to the cause, and all believed that the Filipino is worth dying for. Yet their courage was magnified by the thousands of unnamed Filipinos who stood shoulder to shoulder in moments of struggle. These ordinary citizens, whose names may never appear in our textbooks, carried banners, raised their voices, and filled the streets with a quiet strength that changed the course of our history. Together with the great figures we remember, they remind us that the power of a people united in purpose can be as transformative as the sacrifices of any single hero.

IMPORTANT: SCHEDULE CHANGES (BEGINNING MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 1)

We wish to inform you of some adjustments to our class schedule, These adjustments are based on recent observations and feedback from both students and teachers and will begin on **Monday, September 1**.

1. First Period Adjustment

- Beginning Monday, September 1, 2025, the first period will begin at 8:10 AM instead of 8:00 AM.
- This adjustment will remain in effect until the end of the First Quarter.

2. Lunch Break Extension (MYP: Grades 7-10)

- The MYP lunch break will be extended from 30 minutes to 45 minutes.
- This has been made possible by slightly reducing the time allocated to Study Hall, Advisory, and Counseling sessions. The extended lunch break will be in effect for the remainder of the academic year.

3. After-School Activities (Grades 7–12)

- To accommodate these adjustments, after-school activities will begin at 3:10 PM (instead of 3:00 PM) from Monday to Thursday.
- Friday dismissal will remain at 3:00 PM.

Please note that there will be no changes to the length of each subject period, and bus departure times from both Magallanes and Rockwell will remain unchanged.

We believe these changes will enhance the learning environment during the first period and provide a more balanced break for our students. We will review these adjustments at the end of the First Quarter and communicate any further updates as necessary.

BA REMEMBERS NINOY AQUINO

In commemoration of Ninoy Aquino Day, the Beacon Academy community came together to reflect on the life and legacy of one of the Philippines' most influential figures. Organized by the Individuals & Societies (I&S) Subject Group, a series of thoughtful displays were set up in the lobby of Building A and the Gallery in Building B, featuring videos and photos of Ninoy Aquino.

These displays connected key moments in Ninoy's life to the IB Learner Profile, highlighting him as a Thinker—through his time as a senator—and as a Risk-Taker, particularly in his decision to return to the Philippines as an opposition leader during a time of political unrest.

Community members were invited to engage with the exhibit by writing reflections on post-it notes, sharing what Ninoy's legacy means to them today. They were also encouraged to take part in a symbolic gesture by tying yellow ribbons around the trees and posts on campus, echoing the national movement that welcomed Ninoy home.

In addition, the library in Building A featured a special display of books and reading materials for those who wanted to explore more about his life and impact.

As an author, he has published over 30 children's books and graphic stories, winning the Palanca Awards, PBBY prizes, National Book Awards, and a spot on the International Board on Books for Young People Honour List. In 2022, he was honored with UMPIL's Gawad Pambansang Alagad ni Balagtas Lifetime Achievement Award for his contributions to Philippine children's literature.


